

Bagpipe

There are several options for using a solo bagpiper at a wedding.

- 1) At the church, piping the bride/groom and wedding party out at the end of the service.
- 2) Piping the bride and groom into the reception. Then, leading them to their table and playing a salute. (Usually a medley of 5-7 tunes). Remember, bagpipes are loud, definitely not background music. The lone piper is mainly for ceremonial use.

1. Murdo's Wedding- Usually played for just the bridesmaid. It is repeated to accommodate any amount of bridesmaids.
 2. Marie's Wedding- Usually played for just the bride. It is similar to Purcell's "Trumpet Tune" or Pachelbel's "Cannon in D". It is played until the bride and groom
